

# The Legendary **Peggy Seeger**

Raleigh, NC Thursday, October 24th



You have rare chance to see **North Carolina** legend, **Peggy Seeger**, in an intimate house concert setting.

A legendary singer of traditional songs, **Peggy Seeger**, also composes music for films, television and radio. Over her long career, she has recorded 19 of her own albums and has appeared on "more records than she can remember." In 1959 she settled in London and married **Ewan MacColl**. **MacColl** and **Seeger** were at the forefront of the British folk song revival for the ensuing three decades. Their innovative work brought traditional folk writing techniques to contemporary songs and strengthened the ties between traditional and political music.

In the mid-1970's she began to concentrate on feminist and ecological issues. Two of her best known songs are **The Ballad of Springhill** and **I'm Gonna Be an Engineer**. In 1994 she moved back to the USA where she now lives in Asheville, North Carolina.

**Peggy** is a member of the well-known **Seeger** family. She is the daughter of **Ruth** and **Charles**, the half-sister of **Pete** and the sister of **Mike**, all of whom have made enormous contributions to the popularization and preservation of folk music.
